Having been married to Bill for 54 years, this should be one of the easiest of these articles I've written, but, with tears in my eyes, it's also one of the hardest.

Bill was a life-long member of Pentecost

Lutheran Church. He was baptized here, confirmed here, saw his children and grandchildren baptized and confirmed here, renewed his marriage vows at 25 and 50 years here and his funeral service will be here. The last words he said in his life were to pray the Lord's Prayer with Pastor Retzlaff and me after receiving communion for the last time.

Family and church were very important to Bill. He started serving as a church officer as soon as he was home from the service and continued until strokes

prevented him from serving any longer. He was treasurer for over 30 years. He also served as Sunday School superintendent and teacher for a few years.

One friend emailed, "My first thought when I think of Bill is when I was a little kid in the old church and Bill would be home on leave from the service and he would come to church in his uniform--- thought he was a real hero!!"

To his family, he was also a hero and loving husband, father and grandfather. He never missed an activity one of the boys or grandchildren were involved in if he could be there. He loved sports. If possible, we had to be home to watch every Packer game.

Door County was a favorite vacation spot, especially once we got a time share and the family joined us.

We didn't know what to give Bill for Christmas this year because of his health, so God gave him eternal life and Christmas in Heaven. Thank you to all who have expressed their love and sympathy at this time.
