Learning About Each Other~

A couple months ago we learned about **The Kenya Mission**, a mission project important to Living Hope. This month we look at **Dimes for Christ**, a long time Pentecost favorite.

The first Sunday of every month is designated as Dimes for Christ Sunday. It started with loose change collected on this Sunday placed in a special fund to be used for scholarships for students studying to be Lutheran Church Missouri Synod pastors, teachers, or church workers. We now have envelopes marked Dimes for Christ in the

bulletins on the first Sundays. Any contribution marked Dimes for Christ also goes into this fund. For several years, we had a member who matched the donations for the year so we could give even more help. Over the years we've helped many students, both from our congregation and others, studying at our Lutheran seminaries or colleges.


Tom Konz, now Rev. Tom Konz, was our first recipient. The Konz family were members of our congregation. In 1982, Tom left his job at Lincoln Lutheran to study for the ministry. Dimes for Christ gave him \$75 each month for his 4 years at the seminary. Rev. Konz (now retired) was ordained at Pentecost, was one of the pastors who participated in our 100th Anniversary celebration, and also participated in Rev. Brady's installation.

Dimes for Christ presentations became a little more creative when Tom became church treasurer. After learning that Pastor Biber had been a participant on Wheel of Fortune, Tom made him play "Wheel of God's Fortune" as part of his presentation in front of the congregation.

Tom heard Vicar Kyle Schwan knew a lot about art, so had him "judge pictures" one at a time. The Vicar had a little trouble with the dimes – kept wanting to call it money or tell us how many but he finally got it. The 4 really threw him, though. Being in Packer Country he kept thinking it had something to do with the Packers – maybe because it was on a Packer shirt. He did finally get the pictures to say Dimes for Christ.

Tom also got to present the check to his long time classmate Scott Firminhac. This was done on Christmas Day, 1995. The Voters' Assembly voted to give Scott \$500 from our Dimes for Christ -Scholarship Fund. Shortly after the service, one of our members matched that amount. The Kosmala's daughter, Leah, was also one of the recipients.

KENYA MISSION HIGHLIGHTS

Pastor Joseph, who works with the mission that we are actively supporting in Kenya, recently provided a very heartfelt Thank You to our congregation through Diane Kosmala for the recent support we have shown, including the free will offerings from the two most recent Lenten, Wednesday night dinners. During the dinners, approximately \$300 was collected and subsequently forwarded to Pastor Joseph. The impact of these contributions included (or will include in the very near future) the provision of food for a deaf community, a wheelchair that will enable a young girl to attend school, a safe place for two homeless mothers to stay and the opportunity for a young orphan girl to begin school. \$300 of contributions here in the United States translates to a far larger impact in these Kenyan communities.
