As forgiven children of God, we, the Pentecost Family of Faith, are committed to show everyone Life in Christ.

Early each morning, when the house is still quiet, when everyone else is still asleep, and the only noises heard are coming from the birds outside our window and my snoring dog, I read through my daily devotion. It seams to be the only time I can peacefully read scripture without the chaos of little children being silly, or crying, or asking to go out and play, or telling me that they want a snack not a few minutes after we had just eaten breakfast or lunch.

Currently, I am working through the book of Psalms. With the recent celebration of Easter, I thought I'd write on Psalm 35. If your Bible is near by, please open it with me.

Psalm 35 is a prayer of our Lord Jesus who comes down to Earth to fight on our behalf. He is our warrior. He fights so that He might win our salvation. We cry out to Him just as David cried out to Him when he was facing trouble. "Let not those rejoice over me who are wrongfully my foes, and let not those wink the eye who hate me without cause." (Psalm 35:19) And we see in scripture Jesus cries out to God to fight on His behalf too. He knows the fight will be long. It will be hard. Jesus will fight the most unimaginable darkness.

"Without cause" is mentioned three times throughout Psalm 35. Jesus quotes verse 19 in the book of John. "But the word that is written in their law must be fulfilled: they hated Me without a cause." (John 15:25). Jesus says the world will hate Him, His Father, and His followers. It is a hatred without cause. A wild concept considering that it was in love that God created the world. God pours out His heart to us. We see this in the ministry of Jesus. Jesus fed the hungry, healed the sick, raised the dead. And yet, there was hatred for Him without cause. Isn't sin terrible!

All that hatred of the world-that hatred without cause-led to that dark day on the cross, Good Friday. What an amazing God we have that He would rather shed His blood on the cross than lose us. Jesus loved the world-the world that hated Him-so much that He would give His life so that we would have eternal life. He went to the cross in joy, knowing that from the cross we would have salvation. Jesus rose from the tomb on Easter morning alive! The world may have hated Him without cause, but His love was never without cause. It was a love that was caused by the Father's heart. And the Father never stops loving the world. He never stops fighting for us.
